

Song by LATA Kentucky's Windhorst Memorializes 9/11 Victims

September 11, 2001, is etched in Eddie Windhorst's memory just like the countless others who watched one of the worst tragedies of the 21st Century unfold.

A decade later, the LATA Kentucky team member has written a song, "In A Moment," that commemorates lives lost in the terrorist attacks.

"It was inspired not only by the 9/11 events, but also by James 4:14: 'You are just a vapor that appears for a little while and then vanishes away,' " Windhorst said.

LATA Kentucky, LLC, is the cleanup contractor at the U.S. Department of Energy's Paducah Site.

In late June, Brian Crabb of Dark Diamond Media Services approached Windhorst's band, Reflection, about participating in a multiple-artist compilation regarding 9/11. Crabb had previously recorded the band, which grew from a church praise and worship team.

The band recorded "In A Moment" and Reflection member Barry Driver's new song, "Hangin' On," at Crabb's studio in Nashville, TN, in July. The songs are part of a 30-song project, "Never Forgotten," that commemorates lives lost in 9/11 and honors U.S. veterans, police officers, firefighters, and loved ones affected by the terrorist attacks.
